1. Our common welfare should come first; personal interests follow.

 4. Each Group should be autonomous, except in matters affecting AA as a whole.
 5. Each Group has but one primary purpose - to help those who still suffers.
 6. An AA Group ought never endorse, finance or promote any institution, facility or outside enterprise lest problems of money, power and prestige divert us from our primary spiritual aim.
- Every AA Group ought to be fully self-supporting. Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever non-altruistic. Members may employ special workers. Committees directly responsible to those they serve. Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues. AA should never be drawn into public controversy. Our public relations policy is based on attraction. We need always maintain personal anonymity at all times. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions. We place principles above personalities.
