Dear San Francisco and Marin Fellowship,

This year has been an exciting one of growth for San Francisco and Marin Intergroup. It is my pleasure to share our 2024 Annual Report, enabling us to reach a wider range of local A.A. members with important information about Intergroup's finances, Twelve Step services, and initiatives.

2024 was a good year for San Francisco and Marin Intergroup. We continued the great work

started in previous years, and built on that progress with new projects and events.

Our Intergroup Fellowship Committee hosted the first gala in over twenty years. This event brought together over 300 A.A. and Al-Anon fellows from around the Bay Area for a fun evening of speakers and fellowship. Another gala is planned for September 6, 2025, and we hope this is the beginning of a new annual tradition!

We increased our staff of

special workers and volunteers at Central Office. Our Central Office staff is a talented, hardworking, and joyful crew. If you haven't met them yet, be sure to stop by 1821 Sacramento Street, San Francisco, and say hello! While you're there, you can browse the beautiful bookstore, full of Conference-approved A.A. literature, A.A. Grapevine materials and sobriety medallions.

Speaking of bookstores, we increased our bookstore's outreach by streamlining and reducing shipping costs, participated at two San Francisco A.A. conventions, and hosted the twice-monthly pop-up bookstores in Marin.

Thanks to our Tech Committee, we integrated our database to the 24/7 telephone helpline to meet the changing needs of our Fellowship. With updated technology, our Teleservice Committee is better than ever, ensuring that the hand of A.A. is always available when a still-suffering alcoholic reaches out for help.

All Intergroup service committee chairs are now filled, so we are running on full steam and ready

to fill all service committees with more volunteers. There truly is an opportunity for service at Intergroup for every fellow in A.A. We hope you feel welcome to roll up your sleeves and get involved, wherever your interests and talents lie!

## 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

Intergroup serves the San Francisco and Marin Fellowship. Here are some of our 2024 highlights.



Through the work of the **Outreach Committee**, Intergroup Representative (IGR) participation increased by 17.5% from 2023.



The Intergroup Fellowship Committee hosted a 300+ sold-out **Night of Happy Destiny Gala & Speaker Meeting** in San Francisco. After a hiatus of more than twenty years, the gala was an opportunity to bring greater unity to the San Francisco and Marin fellowship and was in participation with Al-Anon.



Intergroup expanded access to A.A. literature in Marin by adding a **second Marin Pop-Up Bookstore** location. In addition to the Pop-Up at the monthly General Service meeting on the third Monday of the month in San Rafael, a second Pop-Up is now held on the last Tuesday of the month at Tuesday Chip.



Central Office fully migrated to a **new point-of-sale system**, creating a more efficient shopping experience and reducing duplication.



**Participated in PRAASA** (the Pacific Region A.A. Service Assembly) in March 2024 in San Francisco. At PRAASA, Intergroup sold nearly one month's worth of A.A. literature in a weekend.



Intergroup **eliminated the \$10 minimum shipping fee** on our online bookstore at shop.aasfmarin.org.



With support from the **Tech Committee**, the **Teleservice 24/7 helpline** automatically links to our volunteer shifts, ensuring the phones are consistently answered. And if the line is busy, calls go to a voicemail system that is checked regularly.



After a trial period, the **Communications Committee** officially merged with The Point Committee, allowing the committees to work more closely to better serve Intergroup's communication needs.



Central Office sold 784 copies of **The Plain Language Big Book**, the new, Conference-approved book that makes the A.A. Twelve Step program of recovery from alcoholism easy to understand and accessible to all.

#### A.A. Groups

Your group has a voice in San Francisco and Marin Intergroup through your Intergroup Representative (IGR). IGRs represent their group's voice and conscience at the monthly Intergroup meeting.



#### **Service Committees**

Members from the San Francisco and Marin Fellowship perform important 12th Step work through Intergroup-supported Service Committees. Includes: Archives, Communications, Fellowship, HelpChat, Outreach, SF Public Relations, Sunshine Club, Tech and Teleservice.



#### SF and Marin Intergroup

Intergroup provides essential 12th Step services for the local Fellowship that unites and supports A.A. groups and Service Committees in their primary purpose of carrying the A.A. message of recovery to alcoholics. Intergroup's operations are overseen by a Board of Directors.

### **CENTRAL OFFICE**

#### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

These are some of the Central Office accomplishments in 2024.

- Expanded our team of special workers by hiring Brian B., who keeps Central Office open on Saturdays.
- Had 24 Central Office volunteers who came in weekly to provide much-needed Twelve Step work, including greeting customers and answering the Teleservice helpline during Central Office hours.
- Welcomed a handful of Central Office Volunteer "babies," with less than six months sobriety, and paired them with our more seasoned volunteers. We have truly seen newcomer volunteers evolve in the last year.
- Our <a href="mailto:help@aasfmarin.org">help@aasfmarin.org</a> and <a href="mailto:aa@aasfmarin.org">aa@aasfmarin.org</a> email volunteer team responded to nearly 1,200 emails.
- Jackie B., our Central Office Assistant Manager, participated in the Annual Intergroup/Central Offices of A.A. Seminar for Special Workers (ICOAA) in Las Vegas. ICOAA is a great opportunity to connect with other Intergroup special workers and share experience, strength and hope.
- With the help of our human resources subject matter expert, Linda L., the Board approved an updated employee handbook.



### LITERATURE

San Francisco and Marin Intergroup offers a wide selection of Conference-approved A.A. literature and A.A. Grapevine books.

Distributing literature is a major way Intergroup carries the A.A. message, whether in-person at Central Office, through our Marin Pop-Up bookstores or via our online store at shop.aasfmarin.org. In 2024, we carried the message further:


- Intergroup sales of A.A. literature continue to increase year over year. In 2024, our literature sales increased by 32% compared to 2023.
- Created newly designed wallet and prayer cards that are easier to read with larger font sizes. Added two new wallet cards: Acceptance is the Answer and the 3 Legacies, 36 Principles.
- Expanded the Marin Pop-Up to twice a month in San Rafael and increased Pop-Up literature sales by 36% in 2024.
- Increased our global language A.A. literature and now offer Big Books in over 25 different languages.
- Sold 784 copies of The Plain Language Big Book.
- Began selling Our Twelve Steps, A.A. Grapevine's newly published book, featuring A.A. members' personal experiences working the Twelve Steps.
- The Pop-Up Bookstore sold literature for the first time ever at the Living Sober Conference in San Francisco, the oldest LGBTQIA+ A.A. convention.
- Reduced our shipping rates. Rather than charging a \$10 minimum fee for shipping via our online bookstore, customers now pay for postage at cost.
- Expanded our assortment of triplate fancy medallions, which is a great way to celebrate a sponsee or sober friend's A.A. milestone.











#### **TOTAL NUMBER OF A.A. GROUPS: 262**

Of the more than **262 A.A. groups** in San Francisco and Marin, only 73 have active IGRs. That is 28% representation!

- IGRs, also known as Intergroup Representatives, attend the monthly Intergroup meeting to get updates on A.A. at the local level and share information with their groups.
- IGRs let groups know about service opportunities and ways to support San Francisco and Marin Intergroup's Twelve Step services.
- IGRs speak for your group by voting on important local decisions.

\*The total number of groups does not include the SF Area category, which began during the COVID-19 shelter-inplace period and consists of online meetings originating in San Francisco or Marin counties, but not tied to a specific location.




#### SERVICE IN A.A.



### S.F. AND MARIN ARCHIVES COMMITTEE

The Archives Committee preserves the legacy of A.A. through the collection and preservation of archival material, including objects, recordings, photographs, prints, documents and interviews. Their goal is to preserve San Francisco and Marin A.A. history for future generations.

In November 2024, the Archives Committee hosted an Archives Open House at Central Office, which coincided with *The Plain Language Big Book* release party. The open house kicked off with a history presentation on A.A.s "Can-Openers," referring to locally produced pamphlets from Intergroups. This literature goes back to the days of the Akron Pamphlets and includes our very own wallet cards. In addition to several history talks, the Archives Committee hosted a tour of the A.A. archival materials at Central Office, including a hand-painted watercolor of the Twelve Steps originating from the early days of A.A. meetings at San Quentin.





The Archives Committee hosted a sharing session on the newly released *The Plain Language Big Book*. Participants read selections from the book and had the opportunity to share thoughts and reactions to the readings.

The Archives Committee is focusing its efforts on receiving loans and acquiring archival material from long-standing A.A. members for preservation.



### FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE

The Fellowship Committee organizes A.A. events to promote fellowship in San Francisco and Marin.

In 2024, the Fellowship Committee hosted Founders' Day Picnic in the Park (at Golden Gate Park) and the Ugly Sweater Central Office Open House. Their most significant endeavour was the very successful Night of Happy Destiny Gala and Speaker Meeting. This event, held in August 2024 at the United Irish Cultural Center of San Francisco, featured speakers Roger W. (from Kentucky) and Patsy C. (from San Francisco). Over 300+ members of the fellowship attended, and the event was held in cooperation with Al-Anon.

# MEET YOUR INTERGROUP COMMITTEES

San Francisco and Marin Intergroup provides service opportunities at the local level to reach more alcoholics in need. Our Intergroup committees are a great way to get involved with service and have fun. Did you know that in 2024 we filled all of our Intergroup Committee Chair positions? We are so grateful for our committee chairs and their service to A.A.!

**Archives Committee** hosted an Archives Open House at Central Office in November, coinciding with the release of *The Plain Language Big Book*. Additionally, Archives hosted a monthly working session at Central Office, cataloging archival A.A. materials.

Communications Committee provided a wide range of communications support to Intergroup, particularly through *The Point* and *The Buzz*. In 2024, the Communications Committee formally merged with The Point Committee to better serve Intergroup's communications needs. The committee created new content for the <u>aasfmarin.org</u> website on Central Office and Intergroup Representation and designed an infographic that visually shows the relationship between Intergroup, the groups in Marin and San Francisco, and the Service Committees.

**Fellowship Committee** hosted the Founders' Day Picnic in the Park, the Ugly Sweater Party and the *Night of Happy Destiny* Gala and Speaker Meeting, which included Al-Anon participation.

**HelpChat Committee** coordinates a service through <u>aasfmarin.org</u> where newcomers can chat immediately with a sober member of A.A. via a chat bubble. In 2024, over 130 visitors to the <u>aasfmarin.org</u> website reached out for help, and volunteers shared their experience, strength and hope with them regarding their alcohol problems and general questions about A.A.

Outreach Committee raises awareness of San Francisco and Marin Intergroup, service opportunities, and ensures A.A. groups are represented at the local Intergroup through an Intergroup Representative (IGR). In 2024, the Outreach Committee helped increase IGR participation by 17.5% compared to 2023.

San Francisco Public Relations (SFPR) continued efforts to spread the message of A.A. to suffering alcoholics by participating in 11 public outreach events, four of which were geared towards unhoused alcoholics, including the "A.A. in a Nutshell" event at the San Francisco Public Library. Additionally, SFPR assisted with a tour during PRAASA to the SF Public Library, highlighting the committee's outreach efforts to distribute A.A. literature to the Free Recovery shelves.

Sunshine Club brings A.A. meetings to members who cannot attend in-person meetings and want that in-person connection. Sunshine Club members help arrange meetings at A.A. members' homes or in a hospital throughout San Francisco and Marin. In 2024, over 30 Sunshine Club meetings were held (does not include a weekly meeting the Sunshine Club brings to an A.A. member) and six orientations for new volunteers (one of which was held in Novato).

**Technology Committee** works behind the scenes to support the functions of Intergroup and the Service Committees. In 2024, the Tech Committee integrated the Teleservice phone shifts in our database to automatically connect to the 24-hour helpline schedule, reducing the need for duplicate entries. The Tech Committee added the option to select Chip meetings under Meeting Type on the <u>aasfmarin.org</u> Meeting Finder page and worked on making the <u>aasfmarin.org</u> website more ADA-accessible.

**Teleservice Committee** received 5,345 calls on the 24/7 helpline in 2024. Of those, 4,446 were answered. The remaining calls may have gone unanswered due to hang-ups, the line was busy, or it went to voicemail. Our Teleservice Committee continues to be answered 24 hours a day, seven days a week by A.A. members.

## 2024 FINANCIALS

#### **AUDITED**

2024 started as a financially challenging year for San Francisco and Marin Intergroup. In addition to starting the year with a nominal surplus, individual contributions (including Grateful Giver monthly contributors, general contributions from A.A. members, bequests and honorary contributions) were considerably less than in 2023. By the fall of 2024, Intergroup was 29% under budget for individual contributions. In response, Intergroup took significant steps to decrease our expenses and also planned a more conservative approach for our 2025 budget. As year-end approached, the San Francisco and Marin Fellowship and A.A. groups stepped up tremendously in support of San Francisco and Marin Intergroup via Seventh Tradition contributions, individual contributions and an increase in the number of Grateful Givers. We are so grateful for everyone's support of San Francisco and Marin Intergroup, as we rely on the fellowship to carry out Intergroup's Twelve Step services.
